FEND ENDCUP

The FEND ENDCUP, we are very pleased to report, will go ahead this year. The first two modules, clinical management and treatment, and patient education are scheduled to take place in June in London, with the third, research module, taking place in Barcelona in July 2009. We are delighted with the response and commitment from the nurses who have applied for the course this year. The nurses represent a number of countries throughout Europe, both East and West, and appear very keen to increase their knowledge and skills with regard to diabetes. A number of the participants are planning, on completion of the course, to organise similar courses in their own countries. This is an exciting and important further development for the ENDCUP initiative and one FEND has been aiming to achieve.

The Annual Conference will take place in Rome this year on Friday 5 and Saturday 6 September and plans are well underway to ensure a stimulating and interactive meeting. The articles, with a children, young adolescent and type 1 diabetes focus look very interesting.
