The focus of the second day shifted to patient communication. This was underpinned by three people narrating their personal experiences from their daily lives living with diabetes. The audience was very impressed to have the unique contribution of these individuals sharing their life stories.

In the afternoon, the sessions covered the evolving role of the diabetes specialist nurse as

well as political advocacy in Europe and what could be done also in other countries/ regions. Anne Felton, chairperson of the symposium concluded the conference also with an outlook on FEND activities in 2017.
